The Red Oak Apartments are located on West 106th Street, between Amsterdam and Columbus Avenues. Red Oak Apartments provide safe and affordable housing that supports the dignity and independence of each tenant. There are 230 apartments (one bedrooms and studios) for elderly (62 years and older) and/or physically handicapped persons with very low incomes.

Services Red Oak:

The Center at the Red Oak is located in the Red Oak building. It is a full service senior center, funded by the NYC Department For The Aging. The center is open Monday-Friday and offers both breakfast and lunch. A full schedule of activities is available, including Dominos, Crochet, English as a Second Language, Yoga, Crafts, Tai Chi, Sewing, and movies. Membership is free and meals are available for a voluntary donation.

Application Process:

The application process is regulated by the federal government. Applicants must be at least 62 years old and/or live with a physical handicap. Applicants must have very low incomes. Unfortunately, waiting lists for the Red Oak are very long. Applications are reviewed in the order they are received. Vacancies are filled from the waiting list.
